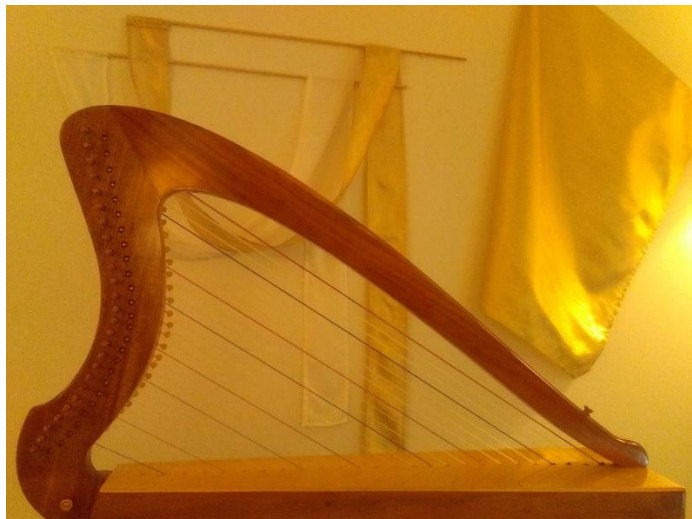

# **Chapter 1**

**Takeaway:** It's better and more efficient to wait on the LORD than to have to clean up the mess that comes from trying to do things your own way. I feel as if the Holy Spirit is saying, "Be very particular who you let into your life. They can become an obstacle to your forward progress."

## **Chapter 2**

### **“What Should I Do with My Life?”**

#### **Dreaming Big Dreams**

In her 30's, Doreen joined a large city church with a young singles' group that numbered about 200. Many marriages emerged from that group, but the young man in whom Doreen was most interested was diagnosed with terminal cancer, and the LORD took him Home.

What was she to do with the rest of her life? God wasn't taking Doreen Home, so He clearly had a purpose for her on this earth. But what was it? She had really wanted marriage to be the next step for her.

Doreen spent days in a glider rocker, gazing out at the trees beyond the balcony, listening for the LORD's leading. She also spent hours talking with and listening to people in the helping professions to help her better understand which of those professions might be a good career fit for her.

A dear friend who is now with the LORD had scored up a personality test for Doreen and told her that she would be good at counseling others. The friend, Joanne, had gone back to graduate school herself to study counseling after her husband had died.

Doreen knew that she had more in her than simply serving as a secretary, helping others with bookkeeping, editing, and mailings. So she signed up for two counseling courses that helped her better understand herself and others.

The psychologists that Doreen met and talked with could understand a complex situation from multiple angles. They could look at a situation from the point of view of what was going on *inside* a person, the thoughts and the feelings, the hopes and the dreams, the motivations, the decision-making process, and the will to act. They could also consider what was going on *outside* the person in a group or workplace. They factored in what had influenced the person from their growing up years. They were patient.

As Doreen waited on the LORD for guidance, she heard Him telling her, “Become a psychologist.” So she applied to doctoral programs in clinical psychology.

The first year that she applied she was placed on a waiting list. The second year that she applied, God gave her favor, and she was accepted. She learned afterwards how many applicants were competing for that spot.

The LORD’s timing was seamless. Doreen handed in her last paper for her master’s program, then climbed back in her car and drove to her first doctoral-level class.

She had been accepted into a peer cohort of about a dozen doctoral students that included three pastors. They offered one another mutual acceptance and support during their years in the program. Doreen understood that this was not typical of other doctoral programs in psychology at the time.

Still, she felt afraid that she might not pass the oral exam. She thought it might help reduce anxiety if she familiarized herself with the setting where the oral exam would take place. So she drove to the exam site, which was located in a health care facility.

Doreen pulled into the parking lot. It was a calm suburban setting, surrounded by trees. She parked, went in to the front desk, and obtained a red visitor's pass. As she walked through the halls, she saw a small room that had been set aside as a chapel.

She entered the chapel, where she was alone, and went to the front of the chapel. She got down on her knees, and asked the LORD to help her pass the exam. She felt like a knight keeping vigil the night before he was about to be knighted.

test. As it is written in Matthew 10:19b, “*When the time comes, you will be given what to say.*” (GW)

## Chapter 4

### “Ask for The Holy Spirit.”

#### Taking Out Self

Emma was on her knees in the kitchen. She knew in her head the right things to do. But she was having trouble with the implementation and follow through. She was having a hard time being consistent, and had been vacillating between doing what she wanted, and doing what she knew God wanted.

She heard a voice, quietly, inside her head: “Ask for the Holy Spirit.” At the time, she couldn’t think of anyone she knew who had done that. But she felt desperate. She had put herself first for long enough, and it was not working.

Emma stood up, went to a comfortable chair in another room, sat down, and asked, **“Come, Holy Spirit!”**

And He did. She shook quietly for 20 minutes. It was Easter Sunday morning.

When the shaking stopped, Emma was hungry to go to church. It had been a long time since she had been in church. Emma got ready and climbed in her car and headed out to church. A reverent obedience followed the trembling and shaking.

Scripture cautions us in Hebrews 10:25, “*We should not stop gathering together with other believers, as some of you are doing. Instead, we must continue to encourage each other even more as we see the day of the Lord coming.*” (GW) And it is written in Philippians 2:12b, “*Be energetic in your life of salvation,*

*reverent and sensitive before God. That energy is God's energy, an energy deep within you, God himself willing and working at what will give him the most pleasure." (MSG)*

The LORD led Emma, in the following years, to serve in multiple churches. In each congregation, she learned and grew. First, He put her in a church where she experienced the comfort of a weekly women's group.

Next, He put her in a church where she had opportunities to help with worship and teach. Then He put her in a church where she learned more about the work and gifts of the Holy Spirit, and connected with precious women of God.

After that, the LORD put a hunger in her heart to visit Messianic congregations led by Jewish people who loved Yeshua, Jesus. She learned more about the Jewish roots of the Christian faith.

She learned of the parallels between what had happened in the Bible and in history, and what was happening in our times today, that she might be warned and choose the right path. She served with people who regularly practiced prayer and fasting, including 24-hour prayer vigils.

Emma also saw what was not working, in the churches and in her. She found that she couldn't look to other people as her source. She needed to go into every situation filled with the Spirit, with something to share. She needed to prepare in advance, to fill up in the Spirit, every time.

She needed a deeper level of personal consecration to her LORD. And she needed to be consistent about it. Emma saw that when she sought Him first, others were blessed and encouraged, and built up in their gifts.

When she sought Him first, she felt more compassion for those before her as she spoke with them. When she sought Him first, she was gentler. It is written in Matthew 20:34, “*Jesus had compassion on them.*” (KJV) When she sought Him first, Emma found herself flowing in His compassion for her and for those around her. When she sought Him first, the Music of His Love bathed and surrounded them.

**Takeaway:** When you wait on the LORD and minister to His Heart, He will minister to your heart. You will come to rest in His Presence. You will be able to operate from His Heart of Love for you and for others.

# Chapter 5

## 36 Hours Straight

### Taking Out Panic

Nadine was in the middle of a panic attack. None of the psychological strategies that she knew was working, and she turned to the LORD for help.

She began praying in the Spirit with unusual ease: tongues were flowing out of her mouth. It was a supernatural equipping and flow.

For the next 36 hours, while she was awake, the Holy Spirit prayed out loud through her. She fell asleep praying, and she woke up with her lips moving in prayer. She discovered that she could pray out loud in tongues on the inhale and on the exhale.

After 36 hours, the unction to pray lifted, and the panic was gone. The panic tried to come back once, but Nadine resisted, and it left. It has not come back.

As you may already know, the word “panic” derives from the name of an evil spirit that accepted human sacrifice. It is not our Abba’s heart that we sacrifice even one minute of our lives to a spirit of fear. It is written in II Timothy 1:7, *“For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.”*

*(NKJV)*

# **Chapter 6**

## **The Glory Harps**

### **Taking Out Unbelief**

“Would you like to go to Israel?” A faithful friend had just called Anna and asked.

Anna didn't have to think long about her answer. She had developed an interest in Israel at age 14, the same summer that she invited Jesus into her life. Israel was the land of the Bible and the land of Jesus. She knew that she would love to go there. She hadn't made visiting Israel a priority because it had seemed too out-of-reach to her.

But the LORD provided the money for the airline ticket, round-trip. The 10-day prayer conference that Anna was to serve at was far less expensive than most tours. The LORD also provided godly friends to transport her to and from the airport.

Once in Israel, Anna joined 2000 prayer delegates from 150 countries. For her, one of the best parts of the conference was hearing how others came to know Jesus.

Another delight was seeing with her own eyes where the Bible stories took place. She stood on Mount Carmel, where God answered Elijah with fire from Heaven. She looked down at the valley where God gave victory to Gideon and Barak. She walked in Nazareth, where Jesus grew up. She stepped into the Jordan, where Naaman was healed. She knelt at Shiloh, where the tabernacle stood, and the boy Samuel ministered to the LORD. She worshipped at Bethel, where Abram built an altar to the LORD his God. And there was more.

Anna spent a lot of time in the 24/7 prayer tower on the top of the hotel. During the conference, Anna and the other prayer delegates were divided up by countries of origin and continents to take two-hour shifts. Together, they prayed around the clock for Israel and for the nations they had come from.

In Jerusalem, Anna saw harp worship for the first time. Some years before the conference, God had led a man in Asia, who had never made a musical instrument, to begin making harps for worship. As he and his friends built the harps, they worshipped. They called them “glory harps.”

At the conference, 24 harpists, from a seven-year-old boy to grandparents, played Scripture songs, melodies that the LORD had given them, on the glory harps. After the concert, the harpists stood up in their simple white gowns to leave the platform, each carrying their golden-colored glory harps. It seemed to Anna like Heaven manifesting. Anna learned that the harpists fasted and prayed together for up to 10 days before serving. She learned that they were part of a 24/7 prayer tower in Asia.

During the day, Anna saw two of the harpists, a young man and a boy, kneeling on a mat in a quiet space on the hotel verandah. The harpists were taking shifts, two by two, to maintain their own 24/7 prayer watch. The young man was playing the harp and singing Scripture songs. The boy beside him was quietly reading Scripture out loud.

Eight years before she went to Israel, the LORD had begun giving Anna melodies for Scripture songs for the keyboard and a harp. She had faithfully written down the songs, scores of them, books of them.

Now Anna began to dream of having a harp to worship on. She wanted to keep vigil with the LORD like she saw the glory harpists doing. One of the harpists told Anna that she hadn't had harp lessons: the Holy Spirit had taught her how to play.

Anna returned to her country of origin and made plans to return to the prayer conference in Israel the following year. Through caring friends, the LORD provided the money for a glory harp.

After Anna began to keep prayer vigils with likeminded believers in her country of origin, the LORD opened the door for her to keep vigil with believers from around the world in Israel. After she faithfully wrote down and practiced the music He was giving her on a small keyboard, the LORD provided a glory harp for her to worship Him on.

**Takeaway:** Abba truly does desire to do more than you could ask or imagine. But you need to align with Him so that He can get His blessings through to you. You need to be where He wants you, when He wants you to be there.

# **Chapter 7**

### **Taking Out Isolation**

Rachel had been looking online herself for spiritual sustenance. After the churches shut down, the congregation where she had been serving began livestreaming. She was grateful, but hungry for more.

She saw others testify of the healing and miracles that Jesus had done for them. Rachel felt encouraged. Surely this was a God who could heal people from the virus and fear that the adversary was trying to spread around the globe.

Rachel watched Sid Roth interview Kevin Zadai. Then she discovered Kevin’s free YouTube videos, and the Warrior Notes School of Ministry courses. She signed up.

How grateful she was when the LORD put on Kevin’s heart to invite students to host small group Bible studies! Kevin would send a link to a short video for each week, along with a discussion guide.

Rachel knew this was an answer to help break the social and spiritual isolation that she had been seeing around her. She and a handful of other believers started a Warrior Fellowship in January 2021. They joined in the Spirit with hundreds of other Warrior Fellowships around the world.

Connection with others who shared the mind of Christ and walked in His Ways was life-giving. The new fellowship began to see deliverance and healings and a sweet spirit of worship and joy and laughter as they gathered together in their Abba's Love for them.

**Takeaway:** As you follow the LORD's leading, and seek to learn and grow, He will direct your steps to likeminded others.

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♥ LORD Jesus, how can I be a better friend to You?
